Why Have a CWF/DWM organization today?

Women have a purpose in the "Body of Christ." Each purpose reveals the ways in which the Christian Church (DOC) women understood historically their unique response to the "call to serve."

It's not the only channel through which women can take part in the work of the church; but it's the oldest channel.

As the organization remains sensitive to and grows with the issues of the era in which it finds itself, it continues to fulfill its purpose.

Builds Relationships

Relationships are formed within these groups.

Leadership Responsibilities – Scheduling, planning meetings, decision making, reviewing schedules, make revisions (for herself in consultation with the committee). You have to be prepared to make adjustments in order to reach your goal. Questions may come up in your meeting. "What cannot wait and what can be deferred or dropped? Are there any new concerns; what changes are necessary in order to meet the goal?"

Report to others who are helping you in meeting the group's goal. You must have a mutual agreement among your women. With this, the leader and committee draws strength and it ensures you in reaching the goal.

Evaluation – after all is said and done at the end, there's the evaluation. Share with your committee your frustrations and your joys and accomplishments. It gives the leader a better insight for creative planning with future activities and future leaders. Also, you will learn from mistakes that were made, if any!
